SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

JUDGE MARY LOGAN has been practicing law for over 30 years as a licensed attorney in California (1988) and in Washington (1996) with a broad base of experience starting as a Medical Malpractice Attorney from 1988 until 1994 then hired by the civil defense firm representing 13 Cities along the Central Coast of California. In 1996 she moved to Spokane, was ultimately hired by the City of Spokane Public Defender's Office in 1997 until her appointment to the newly minted Municipal Court bench in 2009. She was the Presiding Judge of the Spokane Municipal Court from 2009 through 2014 and has been a sitting judge since appointment.

As a Judge, she has been an elected member of the DMCJA Board of Governors from 2010-2014, and presently with committee work on the Therapeutic Courts Committee, Pre-Trial Task Force Co-Chair, Trial Court Sentencing and Supervision Committee (formally the Adult Static Risk Assessment Committee-currently on hiatus,), the DV Task Force, the Board for Judicial Administration, was asked to join the NSCI Judges COVID-19 Benchbook Task Force and is Dean Emeritus for Judicial College.

She was awarded the Judicial Leadership Award in 2015 from the Access to Justice Board, the Justice Hero Award for her work in Community Court from the Center for Justice in 2014, the Certificate of Excellence Mayoral Award for Teamwork involving her work with Community Court in 2014 and Certificate of Special Congressional Recognition for her work with Veterans in Veterans' Enhanced Therapeutic Court for the City of Spokane. Spokane Municipal Community Court was awarded the Washington State Bar APEX Award of Merit in September, 2018.

AMIE ROBERTS is originally from the Los Angeles area. She attended college and lived and worked in Utah for almost 20 years before moving to Washington State in 2011. Amie started her career working with victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. She has held many jobs in the victim services field.

Amie earned her BA in Spanish Literature, her MA in Counseling and is a Certified Public Manager. She is also a licensed mental health counselor with experience working in substance use, mental health and domestic violence offender treatment. Amie created a DV offender program from the ground up while working in Utah. This is where she discovered a passion for domestic violence intervention treatment.

Amie worked for over four years as a Mental Health Program Administrator with the review team at the Division of Behavioral Health and Recovery in Washington State prior to her current position. Amie is currently working at the Department of Social and Health Services as the Domestic Violence Perpetrator Treatment Program Manager. She spearheaded the effort to revise the Washington Administrative Code for domestic violence treatment providers, serves on the house bill 1517 workgroup, chairs the domestic violence treatment advisory committee, conducts reviews and investigations of certified domestic violence programs, and has presented at multiple conferences.
