SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

STAN F. CORBIT is an attorney at Piskel Yahne Kovarik, PLLC. His practice emphasizes commercial litigation, including consumer protection, creditor-debtor, and other complex commercial disputes. Stan received his undergraduate degree from the University of Washington and his law degree from Washington University in St. Louis, which he attended on a merit scholarship. Prior to law school, Stan spent nearly three years in China teaching English at a university. Stan is licensed to practice in Washington, the U.S. District Courts for both the Eastern and Western Districts of Washington, and the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals.

DAVID P. GARDNER joined the law firm of Winston & Cashatt, P.S. in August of 2007 and became a principal in 2012. His practice focuses on bankruptcy, creditor's rights, insolvency law, and commercial litigation. Mr. Gardner provides representation for debtors, creditors, trustees, and receivers in all aspects of Chapter 7, 11, 12, and 13 bankruptcies and state court insolvency proceedings. Mr. Gardner litigates civil matters in state and federal courts in Washington, Idaho, and Montana. Mr. Gardner also prosecutes and defends appeals in state and federal courts.

Dave graduated from Western Washington University with a BA in Political Science, Philosophy, and Economics in 2002 and graduated *cum laude* from Gonzaga University School of Law in 2007 where he received his Juris Doctorate.

Mr. Gardner is admitted to practice law in Washington, Idaho & Montana and is licensed to practice before the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Washington and the U.S. District Court for the District of Idaho. He is a member of the Federal Bar Association for the Eastern District of Washington, the American Bankruptcy Institute, and is a past-president of the Spokane County Bar Association.

KIRK MILLER grew up Cheney, Washington, just outside of Spokane. After completing his undergraduate degree studying microbiology at Eastern Washington University, Kirk attended Gonzaga Law School. During his last year of law school, Kirk attended his first NCLC Consumer Litigation Conference in Washington D.C. This is where he became passionate that he would practice consumer law in the wake of the foreclosure crisis after meeting so many inspired attorneys at the conference. After law school, Kirk opened a solo practice focusing in consumer rights litigation. Kirk is a member of the National Association of Consumer Advocates and serves as the NACA state chairman for Washington. He has lectured on debt collection defense and FDCPA topics to attorneys in Washington State and throughout the country. Kirk is admitted to practice in all State and Federal District Courts for Washington State, as well as the Ninth and Sixth Circuit Courts of Appeals. He has argued cases in the Washington Court of Appeals and the Washington Supreme Court. Kirk also serves on the board of directors for Family Promise Spokane, the Spokane Volunteer Attorneys Advisory Committee, and was one of the attorneys who formed the Spokane Bar Association Consumer Advocacy Program.

PROFESSOR MILTON G. ROWLAND has been an adjunct professor at Gonzaga since 1987, with one year off to teach at the University of Denver College of Law.

Professor Rowland is a 1975 *cum laude* graduate of the University of Detroit-Mercy, and a 1985 *summa cum laude* graduate of Gonzaga University School of Law. He was first in his class at Gonzaga, where he won 16 academic awards.

Since graduating, Prof. Rowland has pursued two parallel career paths:

In one, he is a civil litigation attorney. Licensed in Washington from 1986-present and Idaho from 1986-1993, Rowland has tried a wide range of civil and administrative cases, ranging from constitutional tort cases to highway design and employment discrimination cases. He was the Senior Assistant City Attorney for the City of Spokane, Washington, from 1993 to 2007. In April, 2007, Milt joined Foster Pepper PLLC as Of Counsel, involved in the litigation and municipal law practice groups, among others.

In his second career path, Prof. Rowland teaches, writes and lectures widely in the law. He was named adjunct Professor of the Year at Gonzaga Law School every year the award was given until 2000, when the Student Bar Association renamed the award in his name.

He has written chapters for two books on tort and trial practice, and has lectured extensively on ethics, property, constitutional, trial practice and municipal liability issues in the Washington, King County and other Bar groups.

ANDREW M. WAGLEY is an associate with the law firm of Etter, McMahon, Lamberson, Van Wert & Oreskovich, P.C. Mr. Wagley graduated *cum laude* from University of Washington Michael G.
